Her authored books are: *Postformal Education: A Philosophy for Complex Futures* (Springer, 2016); *The Secret to Growing Brilliant Children* (Bear Books, 2020); & *The Future: A Very Short Introduction* (Oxford University Press, 2017).

As a speaker, consultant, and trusted advisor, Jennifer's international engagements include futures-focused projects in Europe (Czech Republic, Finland, France, Germany, Luxembourg, Poland, Romania, Spain & Sweden), Asia (Malaysia, Shanghai & Taiwan), the Middle East (Egypt, UAE and Iran), UK and USA. Her unique projects include: 'Unlocking Foresight Know-How', UK; 'Positive Future Trends', Futerra Group, London, UK; design of an Executive Education Level 'Introduction to Futures Studies' Course in Tehran, Iran; Foresight Factory, UK; and online course creation on 'Global Futures' for Ubiquity University, USA.

She is an Adjunct Professor at the Institute for Sustainable Futures, University of Technology Sydney (UTS), & Southern Cross University, Lismore NSW. She has held academic posts in four Australian universities, including pioneering the online cohort of the Masters in Strategic Foresight, Swinburne University Melbourne. Jennifer has also held a Visiting Professorship at Olomouc University, Czech Republic; Visiting Research Fellowship at SciencesPo, Paris, France; and is a Fellow at the Botin Centre, Santander, and LAB, Barcelona, both in Spain.
